Sustainable Forestry Policy for Graphic Packaging International, LLC

Graphic Packaging International, LLC. (The Company) is committed to the goals of sustainable forestry and promoting responsible resource management and use. To achieve these goals, the Company implements the Sustainable Forestry Initiative® (SFI) Sourcing Standard and the Chain of Custody Standard; the Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC) Chain of Custody and Controlled Wood Standards and the Program for the Endorsement of Forest Certification Schemes™ (PEFC) Chain of Custody Standard.

The Company implements best efforts to avoid trading in wood or wood fiber that is:

- a) illegally harvested,
- b) harvested in violation of traditional and civil rights,
- c) harvested where global conservation priorities or sensitive ecosystems are threatened,
- d) harvested in natural forests undergoing significant conversion to plantations or non-forest uses, and
- e) from forests in which genetically modified trees are planted.

The Company is committed to increasing its overall sourcing of wood material from certified and responsible sources. In addition to the above Standards, the Company recognizes and promotes certification to the American Tree Farm System (ATFS) Standard and other internationally recognized certification standards.

The Company's Policy is to implement and achieve the Principles of Sustainable Forestry including environmentally, socially and economically sustainable practices to meet the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their needs. This is accomplished by practicing and promoting a resource and conservation stewardship ethic.

To help implement and achieve the above sustainability objectives, the Company has developed and adopted appropriate programs and documented procedures to guide its wood and fiber procurement, production of certified products and associated environmental claims and labels.

The Company is committed to annually review the effectiveness of its policy and programs as part of management review to continually improve the management systems and overall environmental performance.
